AMENDED TRIAL PREPARATION ORDER

The parties' Joint Motion to Amend Trial Preparation Order (Doc. 160) is GRANTED IN PART. Pursuant to the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and the Local Rules of Practice for the United States District Court for the District of Colorado, it is ORDERED that:

1. The ten-day jury trial set to commence on February 6, 2023 is VACATED, and a **five-day jury trial** is RESET to commence at **9:00 a.m.** on **February 13, 2023** in Courtroom A 1002 of the Alfred A. Arraj United States Courthouse, 901 19th Street, Denver, CO 80294;

2. The Final Pretrial Conference set for January 11, 2023 is VACATED and RESET for **2:30 p.m.** on **January 19, 2023** in Courtroom A 1002; and

3. The Trial Preparation Conference set for February 1, 2023 is VACATED and RESET for **12:30 p.m.** on **February 9, 2023** in Courtroom A 1002. It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following tasks must be completed by the date indicated. The Court adopts the parties' proposed amended deadlines with minor adjustments. Except as otherwise stated in this Order, the form and content of the parties' pretrial disclosures and objections must comply with Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 26(a)(3).

For rebuttal witnesses previously designated by one or both sides, the green highlights must be added to the highlighted transcripts disclosed to and/or received from the defendant's side. Do not file this disclosure via CM/ECF.
Five weeks before the Final Pretrial Conference	Disclose Exhibit Lists Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(a)(3)(A)(iii)
	Each side must serve on the other a dis- closure identifying each document or other exhibit it expects to or may offer at trial. Do not file these disclosures via CM/ECF. Thereafter, counsel must confer to eliminate duplicate exhibits and pre- pare the proposed joint exhibit list that will be filed with the Court.
Four weeks before	Exchange Objections
the Final Pretrial Conference	to Deposition Designations Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(a)(3)(B)
	The parties must exchange lists of any objections each side has to the deposition testimony designated by the other. Do not file these objections via CM/ECF. There- after, the parties must confer and make reasonable, good-faith efforts to resolve their objections.

Four weeks before the Final Pretrial Conference	Exchange Objections to Exhibits Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(a)(3)(B) The parties must exchange lists of any objections each side has to the exhibits disclosed by the other. Do not file these objections via CM/ECF. Thereafter, the parties must confer and make reasonable, good-faith efforts to resolve their objec- tions.
Four weeks before the Final Pretrial Conference	File Proposed Jury Instructions The parties must jointly file a single in- tegrated set of proposed jury instructions and verdict forms via CM/ECF. The par- ties should attempt to stipulate to the jury instructions, particularly "stock" in- structions and verdict forms. Each in- struction should be numbered, and same- subject disputed instructions should be grouped and numbered together (e.g., "Stipulated Instruction No. 1," "Plaintiff's Instruction No. 2," "Defendant's Instruc- tion No. 2"). Each numbered instruction must begin on a new page. Each proposed instruction must identify the source of the instruction and supporting authority. The parties must also email a copy of their proposed instructions and verdict forms in editable Word format to <u>Domeni</u> <u>co_Chambers@cod.uscourts.gov</u> . Pro- posed verdict forms must be submitted in a separate file from the proposed jury in- structions.

	Copies of the pertinent highlighted depo- sition transcripts must be filed as exhib- its to the filed objections.

	(e)blank column for the Court's rul- ing.

	Each side must also email a copy of its objection chart to the other side in editable Word format.

	Motions <i>in limine</i> are discouraged when the motion cannot be resolved until evi- dence is presented at trial; instead, such evidentiary issues can be flagged in a trial brief.

	Each side must file its responses to the other side's objections by filling in the designated column in the chart(s) filed by the other side.

	No replies to deposition objections will be permitted without leave of Court.
Seven days before	File Responses to Exhibit Objections
the Final Pretrial Conference	Each side must file its responses to the other side's objections by filling in the designated column in the chart filed by the other side.
	The responding side must also email an editable Word copy of the objection chart with responses to <u>Domenico_Chambers@cod.uscourts.gov</u> .
	No replies to exhibit objections will be permitted without leave of Court.
Seven days before	File Responses to Motions in Limine
the Final Pretrial Conference	No replies to motions <i>in limine</i> will be permitted without leave of Court.
Seven days before	File Trial Briefs (Optional)
the Final Pretrial Conference	Trial briefs are encouraged, but not re- quired, and a trial brief may not be used as a substitute for a motion. If filed, trial briefs must not exceed 2,700 words .

the Final Pretrial Conference	Cross-Examination Time
	The parties must file an estimate of the time required for their cross-examination of each of the opposing side's witnesses.
Two business days before	Submit Trial Exhibits
Trial	The parties must provide the Court with two hard copies of a single inte- grated set of their trial exhibits (one set of original exhibits and one copy for the bench) and one electronic copy of their trial exhibits. All exhibits must be pre- marked with a label identifying the ex- hibit number and case number.
	The hard-copy exhibits must be bound in one or more three-ring binders no larger than three inches in width, and the binders must be labeled on the cover and on the spine with the case caption, trial date, and "ORIGINAL" or "COPY."
	The electronic-copy exhibits may be de- livered to the Court on USB flash drive or submitted by email to <u>Domenico Cham</u> <u>bers@cod.uscourts.gov</u> as attachments or via secure download link. Do not file the exhibits via CM/ECF. Except for any video or audio exhibits, electronic exhib- its must be in PDF file format. The file name for each electronic exhibit must in- clude the exhibit number and description (<i>e.g.</i> , "Ex 1 - Employment Contract.pdf").

	The parties must provide the Court- room Deputy with three hard copies (an original and two copies) of their final joint exhibit list. The parties may remove any exhibits they no longer expect to or may offer, but they may not add new ex- hibits not included on their initial exhibit list disclosures without either the consent of the opposing side or leave of Court. If the final joint exhibit list differs from that filed previously, the final exhibit list must also be filed via CM/ECF.
First day of Trial	Submit Final Witness Lists
	The parties must provide the Court- room Deputy with three hard copies (an original and two copies) of their final witness lists. The parties may remove any witnesses they no longer expect to or may call, but they may not add new wit- nesses not disclosed on their initial pro- posed witness lists without either the consent of the opposing side or leave of Court.
	If the final witness lists differ from those filed previously, the final witness lists must also be filed via CM/ECF.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the parties should be prepared to address the following issues at the Final Pretrial Conference:

- 1. The proposed Final Pretrial Order;
- 2. Any outstanding motions, including motions in limine;
- 3. Jury selection, including the parties' proposed *voir dire* questions;
- 4. Jury instructions;

5. Sequestration of witnesses;

6. Time limits for opening statements;

7. Timing and presentation of witnesses and evidence, including the use of deposition testimony and any objections thereto;

8. Any anticipated evidentiary issues, including any objections to exhibits and the necessity for any cautionary or limiting instructions;

9. Any stipulations of fact or law; and

10. Any other issue affecting the duration or course of the trial.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that, should the parties wish to conduct a mediation, the mediation must be completed in advance of the Final Pretrial Conference.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that counsel and pro se parties must be present on the first day of trial at 8:30 a.m. Jury selection will begin at 9:00 a.m. Commencing the second day of trial, the normal trial day will begin at 9:00 a.m. and continue until 5:00 p.m. The trial day will have morning and afternoon recesses of approximately fifteen minutes in duration, and a lunch break of approximately 90 minutes.
